

Cookie Policy

What is a cookie?

A cookie is a small file which asks permission to be placed on your computer's hard drive. This site uses cookie to anonymously analyse web traffic and to allow users to log into the member areas.

We use traffic log cookies to identify which pages are being used. This helps us analyse data about web page traffic and improve our website in order to tailor it to visitors' needs. We only use this information for statistical analysis.

Overall, cookies help us provide you with a better website, by enabling us to monitor which pages you find useful and which you do not. A cookie in no way gives us access to your computer or any information about you, other than the data you choose to share with us.

What cookies do you use?

Company	Cookie Name	Purpose	Expiry time
OSJCT	exp_cookies_allow, exp_cookies_accepted or exp_cookies_declined	Used to track and respect your choices, to remember where you are and to help and protect you.	
OSJCT	exp_last_activity	Every time the webpage is reloaded the last activity is set to the current date and time. It is used to determine form or login expiry. This is essential for logged in users to record their data and not lose it as it is being input.	1 year

Company	Cookie Name	Purpose	Expiry time
OSJCT	exp_last_visit	sets the date and time that the you last visited the site.	1 year
OSJCT	exp_tracker	Tracks the last 5 pages you viewed and is used primarily for redirection after some actions on the site ie moving back to pages.	When user leaves the website
OSJCT	exp_stashid	This cookie generates a unique ID that relates to session values that determine the current state of the website and any actions you have performed.	When user leaves the website
OSJCT	exp_super_search_history	Remembers your search history in the home search on our website.	24 hours
Google	_utma	This randomly generated number is used to determine unique visitors to our site.	2 years
Google	_utmb	This randomly generated number works with _utmc to calculate the average length of time users spend on our site.	30 minutes after user leaves website
Google	_utmc	This randomly generated number works with _utmb to calculate when you close your browser.	When user closes browser
Google	_utmz	This is a randomly generated number and information about how the site was reached (e.g. direct or via a link, organic search or paid search).	6 months
Google	_utmt	Used to throttle request rate	When user leaves website
Google	IDE	set by DoubleClick – a Google partner - to help customise ads across the web.	1 year
